




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ART NORTH/SOUTH CORRIDOR PROJECT MAP




TIFIA Loan Proceeds: VIA is applying for a Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) Loan that will be repaid using revenue from the recently approved Keep San Antonio Moving ballot measure that will allocate an existing 1/8-cent sales tax to public transit starting in 2026.




ART NORTH/SOUTH CORRIDOR SERVICE PLAN*




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

The NEPA process:

- Is required for any project that receives federal funds or that requires federal action
- Provides a tool to analyze how a project may impact the natural and human environment
- Helps decision makers and the public make an informed decision on how to proceed with the project


