What is Advanced Rapid Transit?

Advanced Rapid Transit, or ART, is a high-quality, modern public transportation system that is designed to move more people faster and farther.







VIA Rapid is the name of the new Advanced Rapid Transit service that will provide frequent, reliable and safe transportation options for a growing San Antonio region.

The proposed VIA Rapid Silver Line project is not currently funded for construction and **needs community** input and support to progress.






